The module utilises a thematic approach to the literature studied, with students learning all about Victorian attitudes to poverty and mental health as just two examples.

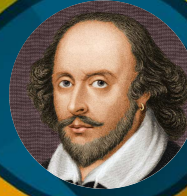


Conflict Poetry
