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School response:

- As a school we have found that thorough preparation for the GCSE examinations leads to the best outcomes for our pupils. Last year pupils and teachers fed back that the December assessments felt 'too late' in identifying gaps in knowledge. In order to address this we introduced a set of assessments in late October allowing pupils feedback from staff and therefore more thorough preparation for December's assessments. The GCSE pupils last year also described that those who had started their revision earliest felt most prepared, and less stressed about the terminal assessments. We fully support our pupils in their preparation for examination and well-being. Many resources are available to all pupils in order to support their revision, and any pupil feeling the strain of GCSE is encouraged to speak to their Progress Tutor or Pastoral Support team. Parents may also find the information available on the websites 'Study Skills' section on how to support pupils preparing for examination useful in supporting their daughter during this important time.
- Pupil toilets are available throughout break and lunch times, although pupils are expected to use the facilities in good time to be punctual to lessons. Staff are asked to use their discretion in response to a child asking to use the toilet during lesson.
