# Book recommendations by Y8 Reading Ambassadors


My favourite type of books to read are Murder Mysteries because I love the tension the authors build up and how they crack the case.








### Book recommendations by Y8 Reading Ambassadors







# Some books I love!





It's about two people in school who are in complete different groups but the girl who learns to live from a boy who has dark thoughts!








This book is about a girl who has a disease and can't leave her house, but when she gets a new neighbour she becomes fascinated in knowing him.


## My book recommendations



## The Yard by Alex Grecian.


This is a book if you love thrillers, with a complex story about a serial killer in Victorian England, brilliant.


It's not that scary but I would recommend you to be over maybe
