In response to these suggestions:

The career fair for our next academic year will be promoted with pupils and parents on our website.

A display about potential career pathways will also be in place for the start of year 11. This will highlight qualifications and qualities needed for the careers our year 10 pupils have identified as of interest to them.

Our independent careers advisor will be invited in more regularly to speak to the pupils in assemblies, and her individual pupil meetings will begin in year 10.

The study support sessions available to pupils from September will be further promoted on display boards in tutor groups, and on our website. These will also be regularly flagged to pupils through progress meeting with their year team tutors.

We will continue to carry out our mock interviews with external agents in preparation for working life, and work experience will be offered in year 12.

The 'stress buster' lunch time sessions will continue with Ms McGlynn, and begin early in the new academic year. Pupil's mental health is extremely important to us as a school, and any pupil feeling they need support can approach any member of staff for guidance in coping with exam pressures.
