Your Year 7 Progress Tutors...

... and Form Time

Your Progress Tutor will be your first point of contact in the school day.

You will register with them in your form room each morning. They will help you get ready for your classes by making sure you have the correct:

Uniform Equipment (pen, pencil, ruler, planner) Books for the day

Your Progress Tutor will also lead you in an act of worship (i.e. a prayer or similar moment for thought and reflection) and give you notices for the day.

If you have any problems or questions, Form Time is the time to speak to your Progress Tutors to get help! Once a week you will have a year assembly led by one of your Year Team or one of the SLT (Senior Leadership Team).

On assembly days you must make sure you are in early for school and have time to go to your locker so that you can be lined up by 8.30am, ready to go in to assembly.

There will be other opportunities for you to do things with your form and your year group throughout the school year. These people will be very special to you as you move through the years at Broughton Hall. By the time you leave you will have lots of happy memories of the people you may not know yet but who will be the friends you spend time with every day. Be sure to take part fully in form time and assemblies and always give of your best!





Form Routine

Getting ready for learning

• Go to your locker at 8.30am. Put your bag and coat away and get the books you need for the day, then go straight to your form.

• Take all of the chairs down (for safety) and sit down ready for your Progress Tutor. Make sure you have your full school uniform on, including your blazer.

• Get your equipment out ready for your Tutor to check.

• At 8.40am your Progress Tutor will come in and you should stand behind your chairs to greet them. They will say, "Good morning, 7....." You will reply "Good morning....."

• The late bell goes at 8.45am. As it is important to be punctual and ready for our learning, anyone arriving after 8.45 will stay behind for 10 minutes at the end of that day.



PE at Broughton Hall

Health & Wellbeing

Year 7 students will have PE twice a week. This is important not only to learn about physical education but to get into good habits for keeping active and healthy throughout our lives.

BE ORGANISED for PE lessons - make sure you know what days and lessons you have PE and remember to have your kit on those days.

- Training shoes that are mostly white, with laces

Injury and illness

If you have a genuine injury or illness, you should bring a note to your lesson explaining the issue but you MUST still have of your PE kit with you.

You will still change into your PE kit but will take on a different role within the lesson e.g. leading, officiating, assessing, etc.

Students who forget PE kit

If you forget items of PE kit, you will be expected to borrow those missing items from the PE department and still complete your lesson. You will be given a kit mark in the register. Your PE teachers will talk to you about what consequences kit marks have when you start here at Broughton Hall.

Get used to being organised so you can take part in PE and have fun!

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HINTS & TIPS! Label all items with your name! Items of uniform, including shoes, bags and coats, should contain no logos or coloured trims.

Pale blue and white check shirt (short sleeved, open neck)

Navy pullover (single pale blue stripe around neck and wrists)

> Navy skirt (box pleated 2" wide - not elasticated waist; skirts must not be pulled down onto hips!)

Plain navy socks (no ribbons & bows) - non-shiny navy/black tights may be worn Nov-March Air force blue blazer (with badge) to be worn at all times

Money belts can be worn.

Plain navy or black coat. Other colours, logos, leather, fur or denim are not permitted.

Flat, plain black shoes (not brown) with covered toes and backs for safety. No boots, trainers or sandals.

Uniform



Students should take pride in meeting our school's high standards of presentation. Parents are asked to support school in ensuring school rules are kept.

Navy blue bag for carrying PE kit - this should be left in your locker if you don't have PE.

Hair: tied back (plain black or navy bobble/ribbon). A soft black/navy stretch hair band is permitted. No hair extensions or unnatural hair colours.

Make up is not permitted (this includes false tan, nail polish, false nails/eye-lashes and lip-gloss).

Jewellery: ONE pair of small plain gold or silver stud earrings and a watch with a plain strap. No other jewellery or body piercing is allowed.







