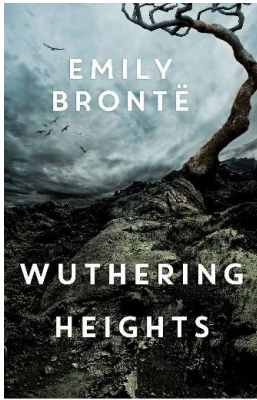
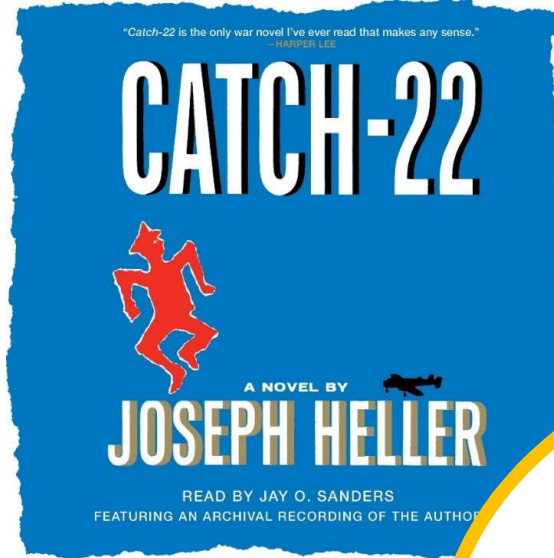

'I love this book because it is great story with great characters that is well written and that tackles an important period of history'.

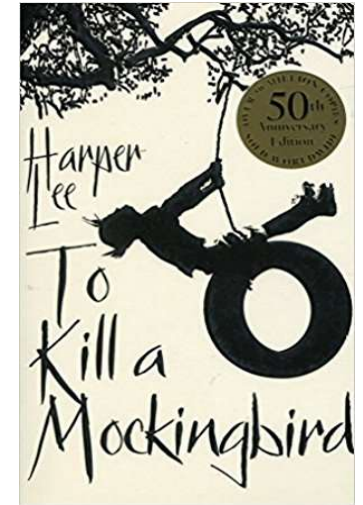


## Wuthering Heights by Emily Brontë

## The Girl with the Pearl Ear Ring by Tracy Chevalier

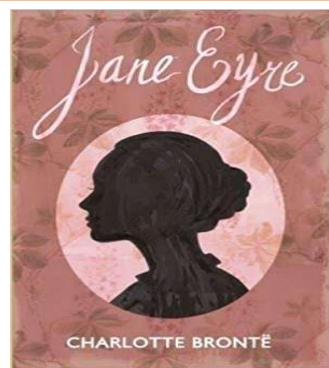
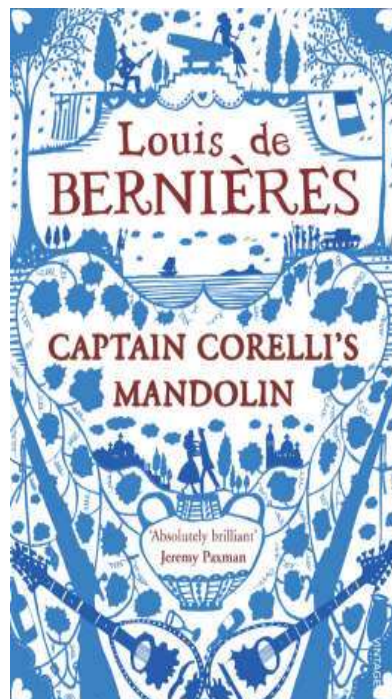
Evocative and atmospheric beautifully written. Real sense of time and place conveyed. Really enjoyed the historical setting.
