Paranormal and Fantasy:

• Cinderella Is Dead – Kalynn Bayron (Available on Audible)



200 years after Cinderella met Prince Charming, the kingdom now requires teen girls to attend the Annual Ball, where the men of the kingdom choose their wives. Sixteen-year-old Sophia — who's way more interested in tying the knot with her childhood best friend, Erin, than some random man — runs away from the ball and bumps into Constance, Cinderella's last known descendant, who's just as eager to topple the patriarchy.

• The Graveyard Book – Niel Gaiman (Available on Audible)



Nobody Owens, known to his friends as Bod, is a perfectly normal boy. Apart from the fact that he lives in a graveyard and is being raised and educated by ghosts.

• 'Mistborn' series by Brandon Sanderson (Available on Audible)



A thousand years ago evil came to the land and has ruled with an iron hand ever since. The sun shines fitfully under clouds of ash that float down endlessly from the constant eruption of volcanoes. A dark lord rules through the aristocratic families, and ordinary folk are condemned to lives in servitude, sold as goods, labouring in the ash fields. But now a troublemaker has arrived, and there is rumour of revolt. A revolt that depends on criminal that no-one can trust and a young girl who must master Allomancy - the magic that lies in all metals.

• Harry potter series by J. K. Rowling (Adapted as a film series) (Available on Audible)





Harry Potter has never even heard of Hogwarts when the letters start dropping on the doormat at number four, Privet Drive. Addressed in green ink on yellowish parchment with a purple seal, they are swiftly confiscated by his grisly aunt and uncle. Then, on Harry's eleventh birthday, a great beetle-eyed giant of a man called Rubeus Hagrid bursts in with some astonishing news: Harry Potter is a wizard, and he has a place at Hogwarts School of Witchcraft and Wizardry.

• The Hobbit – J. R. R. Tolkein (Adapted as a film) (Available on Audible)



Bilbo Baggins is a hobbit who enjoys a comfortable, unambitious life, rarely travelling further than the pantry of his hobbit-hole in Bag End. But his contentment is disturbed when the wizard Gandalf and a company of 13 dwarves arrive on his doorstep one day to whisk him away on a

journey 'there and back again'. They have a plot to raid the treasure hoard of Smaug the Magnificent, a large and very dangerous dragon....

• 'Lord of the Rings' series by J. R. R. Tolkein (Adapted as a film series) (Available on Audible)



In a sleepy village in the Shire, a young hobbit is entrusted with an immense task. He must make a perilous journey across Middle-earth to the Cracks of Doom, there to destroy the Ruling Ring of Power - the only thing that prevents the Dark Lord Sauron's evil dominion.

• 'The Discworld' series by Terry Pratchett (Adapted as a film) (Available on Audible)



An incompetent and cynical wizard named Rincewind, who is hired as a guide to naive Twoflower, an insurance clerk from the Agatean Empire who has come to visit the greatest sights of the Discworld. The two are accidentally hurled into an intrepid adventure through accidents and divine intervention, with talking swords, walking luggage, fate, destiny and gambling gods.

• Dodger – Terry Pratchett (Available on Audible)



Dodger is a tosher – a sewer scavenger living in the squalor of Dickensian London. Everyone who is nobody knows Dodger. Anyone who is anybody doesn't. But when he rescues a young girl from a beating, suddenly everybody wants to know him. And Dodger's tale of skulduggery, dark plans and even darker deeds begins.

• Holes - Louis Sachar (Adapted as a film) (Available on Audible)



Stanley Yelnats' family has a history of bad luck, so when a miscarriage of justice sends him to Camp Green Lake Juvenile Detention Centre (which isn't green and doesn't have a lake), he is not surprised. Every day he and the other inmates are told to dig a hole, five feet wide by five feet deep, reporting anything they find. The evil warden claims that it is character building, but this is a lie, and Stanley must dig up the truth.

• 'Percy Jackson' series by Rick Riordan (Adapted as a film) (Available on Audible)



After learning that he is the son of a mortal woman and Poseidon, god of the sea, twelve-year-old Percy is sent to a summer camp for demigods like himself, and joins his new friends on a quest to prevent a war between the gods. • 'Chronicles of Narnia' series by C. S. Lewis (Partially adapted as a film series) (Available on Audible)



Over a series of fascinating books, a rolling cast of children enter a magical world of talking fauns and flying horses, where the evil White Witch has cast Narnia in perpetual winter. Kings, Princes, magical lions, many perils and cunning exploits.

• American Gods – Niel Gaiman (Available on Audible) (TV Series The Expanse)

• 'The Beautiful Creatures' series by Kami Garcia and Margaret Stohl (Available on Audible)

First, she has no soul. Second, she's a spinster whose father is both Italian and dead. Third, she was rudely attacked by a vampire, breaking all standards of social etiquette.

• 'The Vampire diaries' series by L. J. Smith (Available on Audible) (TV series)



Elena Gilbert is a high school golden girl, used to getting what she wants. And who she wants.
